Dear Jim:

Last December I decided to continue the MK-12A higher yield reentry vehicle in R&D, but to defer a production decision pending our continuing assessment of Soviet ICBM capabilities. I have continued to review this program and have now concluded that because of continued Soviet ICBM deployments and the decision to maintain the option to continue MINUTEMAN III production, it is desirable to submit a FY 1977 Budget Amendment to provide procurement funds for the MK-12A higher yield reentry vehicle in FY 1977 instead of waiting until FY 1978.

Accordingly, I propose a Budget Amendment of \$56.3 million for the Missile Procurement, Air Force appropriation.

My staff is working with your staff to prepare the necessary authorization and appropriation documentation.

Dear Jim:

Last December I decided not to request funds in FY 1977 for continued MINUTEMAN III production. However, my <u>Annual Report</u> stated that, depending on the SALT II negotiations and our continuing assessment of Soviet ICBM programs, it might be necessary to request supplemental funding to continue production.

I have continued to review this program and have now concluded that, because we have had more time to note the pace of the strategic arms limitations negotiations, and because of the continued Soviet ICBM deployments since December, we should request the funds necessary to give us the option to continue MINUTEMAN III production in FY 1977.

If Congress approves the Administration's \$40 million reprogramming request, the MINUTEMAN III line will continue operation until about September. In September critical parts of the line will begin to close down and reopening them would be both expensive and time consuming.

I would expect to review this issue again August or September. None-theless, prudence demands that we ask Congress now for approval of funding that will provide us with the necessary options to continue full MINUTEMAN III production.

Accordingly, I propose a Budget Amendment of \$260.7 million for the Missile Procurement, Air Force appropriation and one of \$5.4 million for the Military Construction, Air Force appropriation.

My staff is working with your staff to prepare the necessary authorization and appropriation documentation.
