SUCH INVOLVEMENT IS DANGEROUS AND MUST BE STOPPED AT ONCE. SURREPTITIOUS MILITARY ACTIVITY WILL FURTHER JEOPARDIZE RELATIONS BETHEEN CONGRESS AND THE ADMINISTRATION. IT IS IMPERATIVE YOU GIVE THE AMERICAN PUBLIC A COMPLETE AND HONEST ASSESSMENT OF ALL INVOLVEMENT TO DATE SYNCERELY

I received your telegram of 11 January in which you expressed your concern over United States involvement in the African conflict. As you are aware, I have candidly responded to questions from the press on this subject as has Mr. Greener, the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs.

Dear Shirley:

I received your telegram of 11 January in which you expressed your concern over United States involvement in the Angolan conflict. As you are aware, the Department has responded on the record to numerous questions on this subject.

In short, there is no United States Navy aircraft carrier or carrier task force in Angolan waters. In fact, the nearest deployed aircraft carriers are in the Mediterranean. Routine fleet movements in support of regular Sixth Fleet operations in the Mediterranean are continuing; for example, the Carrier USS Saratoga departed Florida on January 6th as normal replacement for the USS Kennedy.
